You will take a similar route to that of Lucie and Thornton Blackburn who fled Louisville to avoid sale and separation in the 1830s, traveling from downtown Louisville, through the Portland neighborhood, and over the Ohio River to New Albany, Indiana. The Blackburn story will serve as a central thread for discovering this important history, with significant locations, historical details, and additional voices woven into the narrative.



The audio experience will take you to significant locations and landmarks along both sides of the Ohio River.

A walkable/drivable version is available for those who would like to physically experience each location on the audio tour. If you prefer not to travel, experiential visual aids are available for use in the home or classroom.

The program is suitable for students, families, lifelong learners, and individuals interested in learning about our local connections to slavery and the **Underground Railroad.**
